

# City Is Thanked for Naming Of Airfield in Argentina Call

Via an overseas phone call, Amon Carter relayed his appreciation to City Council Wednesday for naming the administration building and airfield at Greater Fort Worth International Airport in his honor.

His message of thanks was expressed to council members by Mayor Deen, who stated that Carter talked with him Tuesday night by telephone from Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Carter told Deen: "Please express my profound thanks and grateful appreciation of this honor . . . I hope that I am worthy of it."

The council last Wednesday unanimously approved the name of Amon G. Carter Administration Building and Field at the giant new airport. The action was requested in a petition presented to council by Marvin Leonard, chairman of the board of the Fort Worth Terminal Corporation, and

signed by 172 business and civic leaders.

The mayor's statement to the council:

"We all appreciate an expression of gratitude, but when such an expression is made from another continent there can be no doubt about its sincerity. Last night Mr. Carter called me from Buenos Aires, Argentina, to ask that I express his appreciation to members of the City Council for naming the administration building and airfield at Greater Fort Worth International Airport in his honor.

"Mr. Carter said 'please express my profound thanks and grateful appreciation for this honor . . . I hope I am worthy of it.'"

Council members officially accepted the "relayed" expression by signing Deen's statement.

Groundbreaking ceremonies at the airport terminal building have been set for 10 a. m. Monday, City Manager Jones said.
