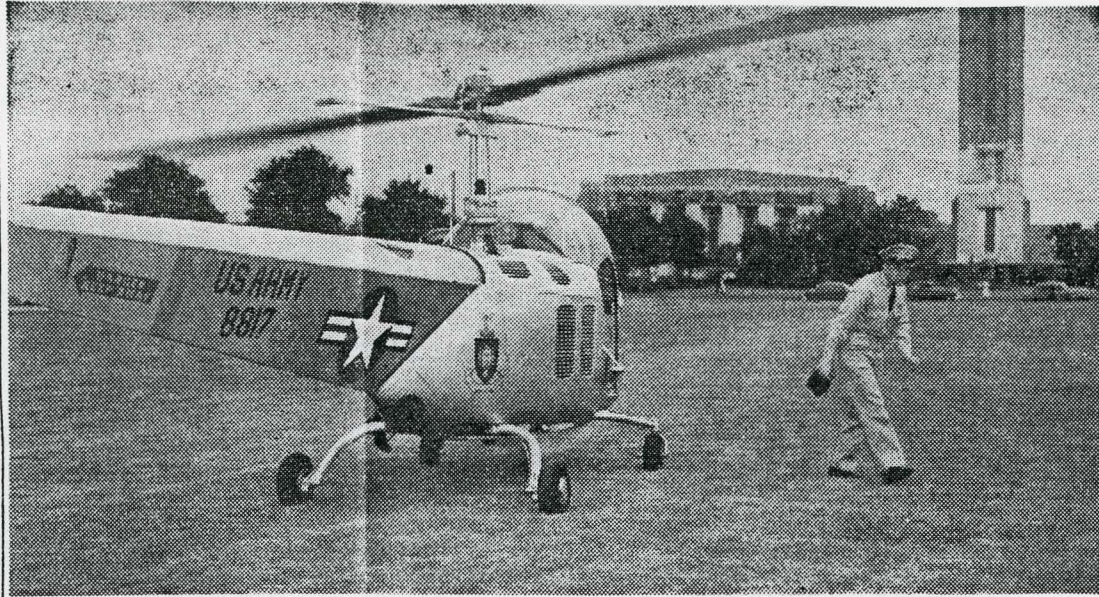

Board Orders Revocation of Realty License

The Texas Real Estate Commission has ordered suspension of one real estate license and revocation of another as a result of a public hearing conducted by the TREC here last spring for two Fort Worth dealers.

Fred G. Prewitt, district inspector for TREC, said he was advised Monday by L. D. Ransom, administrator of the Texas real estate license law, that the license of Mrs. Odell White of 1507 Fairmount had been suspended for 90 days.

The commission also ordered revocation of the license of James S. Baker, 1227 Lincoln.

Army Helicopter Brings Films of Airport Event
