# Bradley Says Eisenhower Message to Stalin in '45 Aroused Churchill's Ire

NEW YORK, April 27 (AP).—General Bradley writes in his forthcoming book that General Eisenhower was involved in a MacArthur-like incident with Winston Churchill.

Eisenhower messaged directly to Prime Minister Stalin regarding the plan to halt the Allied armies on the Elbe River before the fall of Berlin in World War II.

Churchill protested angrily, Bradley says in the book's current installment, appearing in Life magazine.

Both the message and the decision to stop at the Elbe aroused

the British prime minister.

"Although Churchill protested Eisenhower's radio to Moscow as an unwarranted intrusion by the military into a political problem, he reserved his angriest vituperation for the plan Eisenhower had proposed," Bradley writes.

"The prime minister, according to Eisenhower, was 'greatly disappointed and disturbed' that SHAEF had not reinforced (British Gen. Sir Bernard) Montgomery with American troops and pointed him toward Berlin in a desperate effort to capture that city before the Russians took it."

The decision to stop at the

Elbe, rather than to drive on into Berlin, was taken to avoid casualties, and to minimize the risk of accidental collision between the Allied armies, moving east, and the Russians, coming across Germany toward the west.
