

Four motored B-24's will soon be rolling off the production line, each one a shining defender of the freedom of all Americans. We are sure you realize that the completion of this tremendous undertaking and the employment of from fifteen to twenty thousand men, when production is fully under way, will add materially to the business activity of our city.
