EARLY PRODUCTIONS.

Under Fleet's direction, Consolidated Aircraft Corporation developed and produced training planes for the Army and Navy. Observation planes were added to the Consolidated line in 1928. Also developed was a Navy dive bomber, and the company's first flying boat, the PY-1 Admiral. From the flying boat evolved the renowned P2Y and PBY patrol bombers, both of which saw much service during World War II.

Fleet retired as president of the company in 1942 and is currently living in San Diego.

Convair's wartime president was Harry F. Woodhead. He assumed presidency of the com-pany in 1942 and served until

A native of England, Woodhead came to this country in 1909, at the age of 20, and became a naturalized citizen in 1917. He held several executive positions in the steel fabricating industry prior to joining Convair. He is credited with the introduction of mechanized assembly lines for aircraft manufacture. After leaving Convair in 1948, he joined the staff of Douglas Aircraft Corporation, Santa Monica, Cal. He is currently vice president and general manager of the Tulsa division of Douglas Aircraft.

Proceeds of the drive will be used to construct adequate facilities at Camp Mitre Peak, situated at the mouth of Fern Canyon, near Alpine.






