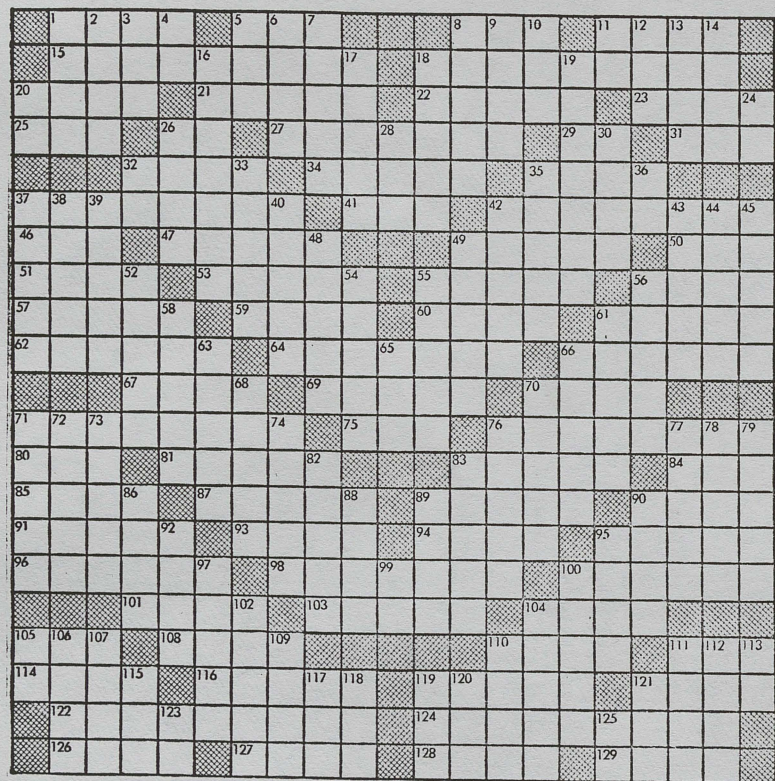

President's Grandson Taken To New York Family Home

WASHINGTON, May 30 (INS). He may be only 5, but Master Dwight David Eisenhower II is beginning to realize that as grandson of a president he is a very important person.

Mother Barbara Eisenhower, as un-understanding as mothers are felt to be by their offspring, has therefore whisked the young man off to the family home in Highland Falls, N. Y. to recover from any possible delusions of grandeur.

Young David and his two sisters weren't even mildly excited by the attention they received from newsmen and cameramen until last Easter and it is doubtful they would have been interested if they had known the cause of the special treatment they received.

On Easter, however, when they posed endlessly in their new clothes, David realized that he and his sisters were something apart—sort of an interim head of the family while father John Eisenhower served as a major in Korea.

In fact, he thought he was such a very important person that his pretty young mother thought a stiff dose of family life away from the White House was indicated.

Grandmother Mamie Eisenhower reluctantly agreed that the children would have a more normal babyhood away from the relentless official spotlight. His grandfather, even more reluctantly, had to give his approval to the move away from the capital.

First With Turboprop

Steam Heats, Cools Plant

building is air-conditioned, and 200,000 pounds of steam are required per hour—which has the same effect as 25,000,000 pounds of ice. Each month 650,000,000 gallons of water are circulated.

## Nippon Temperance Unit Protests Drink by Prince

TOKYO, May 30 (NANA).—In an unprecedented gesture of implicit criticism of the imperial family, the Honorable Temperance League of Dai Nippon has waited on the chief chamberlain of the imperial household, M. Tajima, to protest against reports that the Japanese Crown Prince Akihito, now visiting England, has been sipping cocktails at official ceremonies in his honor during his coronation trip abroad.

"The crown prince is too young to touch alcohol," the temperance officials declared. "Indeed, under Japanese law, he is committing a deliberate offense against the protection of minors' act, as democratically enacted by the Diet.

"His father, the emperor, neither drank nor smoked during his trip abroad as an edifying example to the people of the West. The whole nation joins

us in the sincere hope that bad habits, resulting from foreign travel, will never be allowed to enter the imperial household."
