Re: Fort Worth Air Terminal, Inc.

Have been unable to file the Charter because I could not get all the money. All Charter papers and supporting affidavits have been signed by all subscribers who were in the City, as incorporators. I could not list any one as incorporator who is unavailable to personally execute the papers. I have listed all subscribers, however, as directors, except representatives of the utility companies, and Dan Lydick, who requested they be left off.

Visited each subscriber in his office for signatures and called all those I could reach, who were out of town. We have received a total of \$88,050.00 in checks which are deposited in the bank on which the respective subscription checks were drawn, as suggested by you. This was done even in the case of Mr. Lydick's check on the Union Bank.


Called LaMotte Cohu on July 16th at San Diego. The matter had slipped his mind. He couldn't talk about it then but said he could call me on Monday, July 18th. He has not called and I have hesitated to press it.

The following first half subscription payments have not been obtainable this writing for reasons indicated:

Texas Electric	\$12,500.00	setting up procedure
Telephone Co.	5,000.00	setting up procedure
Transit Co.	2,500.00	setting up procedure
Convair	7,500.00	promised to call
Continental Bank	4,800.00	setting up procedure
Lionel Bevan	5,000.00	in Europe, no instructions

Could go on and incorporate for twice the amount of the subscriptions paid in but does not seem desirable. Understand the utility companies' setup is now about ready and maybe we can go ahead.
