Mr. Richardson's pilots will bring you ten 3# sacks of sausage tomorrow or next day. Mr. Richardson requests that you secure fifty filets and fifty 12-ounce sirloin steaks. These steaks must be top quality, corn fed beef similar to those sent to France last year.

Upon getting hold of these steaks, you are to get in touch with Mrs. Deakins to arrange with American Airlines to deliver these steaks to Mr. Ed Reynolds' office in Washington. I understand Mrs. Deakins knows the complete procedure. The day before American Airlines is to deliver the steaks, Mr. Richardson asks that you contact Mr. Ed Reynolds in Washington at Sterling 3-7393 and tell him the steaks will arrive by American Airlines and that they are being sent by Mr. Carter and Mr. Richardson.

Mr. Richardson says please put a half a dozen of each type of steak in a separate package and mark it with Col. Schulz's name, also put Col. Schulz's name on two of the package of sausage. In your conversation with Mr. Reynolds, please mention that there is also a package of sausage and a package of steaks for Col. Schulz and request that Mr. Reynolds contact Col. Schulz concerning the entire shipment.
