Dear Miss Deakins:


I have your note of the 22d and Miss Meador's supplement of the 23d.

I am reasonably sure that the President would be happy to autograph the photographs which you sent; however, the background is dark and would not lend itself properly to a signature. Therefore, may I suggest that you provide me with four matte prints with a 3/4 or 1 inch border on the bottom of the photograph. Additionally, would you be good enough to provide me with the full names of all the individuals concerned. A policy established years ago by the President precludes the use of nicknames except when the person concerned is a friend of long-standing.

Fortified with the information and material requested, you can advise Mr. Carter that the President will inscribe the photographs at the first available moment.
