# 516 PLANES, 886 PILOTS IN TEXAS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—Texas had 516 aircraft and 886 pilots as of Oct. 1, 1938, the Civil Aeronautics Authority announced Monday.

Of the pilots, 101 held active airline transport pilot certificates, 363 held commercial certificates, 25 held limited commercial certificates, 344 held private certificates, 33 held solo certificates, and 20 held amateur certificates. There were no licensed glider pilots in Texas on the first of October.

Aircraft in Texas numbered 501 which had been certificated and 15 which had not been. There were also two gliders.

In the whole country on Oct. 1, 1938, the total number of aircraft was 11,345, of which 10,091 had been certificated and 1,254 which had not.

Among the 21,528 persons holding pilots' certificates on the first of October were 1,160 airline transport, 6,605 commercial, 980 limited commercial, 10,197 private, 2,241 solo and 243 amateur. The certificated pilots included 608 women classified as follows: Commercial, 72; limited commercial, 30; private, 391; solo, 86; and amateur, 29.
