Dear Mr. Carter:

At long last we are approaching one milepost that will be a welcomed mark along the road, i.e., the time to work out arrangements for the services of an architect for the Terminal building at the new Fort Worth Airport.

In view of my unfamiliarity with technical qualifications and other appropriate factors that should be considered regarding the various Fort Worth architects, I sought counsel and advice from Mr. Buck. Recently he advised me that you had discussed the matter with him and had highly recommended Mr. Joseph R. Pelich as the man to help us on the phase of the work.

I feel quite strongly that in all such matters as this, your judgment is our best possible basis for action, and your recommendations are our best signposts.
