
Dear Mr. Carter:

Thank you for writing me as you did on May 19th about the situation in which your cousin, Paulanne Ream finds herself.

Frankly, we've been receiving a number of complaints pertaining to this same matter. In keeping with the desires of the federal employees who are most interested, I have outlined the problem to the President with the thought that he might feel the circumstances warranted an Executive Order along the lines that the federal employees suggest. I have not had any indication what, if anything, the President proposes to do about it, but I will certainly get in touch with you the moment I have any news.
