My dear Lyndon:

Herewith I am sending you a copy of "L'ART 1 1949 dans la Republique Populaire Roumaine" which was sent to our newspaper with the compliments of the Legation of the Romanian People's Republic. This is a piece of socialistic propaganda that is evidently being sent out of Washington to the newspapers throughout the country.

You will notice on the first page as follows:

"On August 23, 1944, the glorious Soviet Army liberated the Rumanian people from the Hitlerite yoke. And at the same time the Soviet Army brought with it the message of peace and brotherhood among peoples, opening before our people great perspectives of a gree and happy life, unprecedented in our history. The fact that it was the Liberation Army of the land of Socialism that entered Rumania, and not those of the imperialists, looking for new invasions, created, from the very outset...."

It looks lake it is time to call a halt on the "crap" of this kind and I wonder how long our State Department and the American Government are going to continue to tolerate this kind of propaganda. It is my understanding that this is being sent out to the newspapers and public schools throughout the country. It is absolutely astounding.

I don't know what you can do about it, but there certainly should be some method of cracking down on this kind of disloyalty. Frankly, I don't suppose there is a country in the world that tolerates the type of people who are trying to undermine and wreck our country.

We lost hundreds and hundreds of thousands of men, and millions of dollars in money and waste in winning a war and losing the peace. Still our government is devoting time and energy in socialistic ideas and fantastic theories, and all the while we are being undermined by a lot of people who should not be even permitted to live in our country.

Unless the American Government does wake up, we are going to be in the position of holding our ticket until after the show.
