
The Senate Finance Committee began its hearings on the Social Security Bill early in January, and will not complete them until March 24, so we have not yet received any indication of the Committee's attitude toward the new definitions in the bill the House passed last year. However, we have one clue in the fact that Senator George's Committee declined to use a similar definition of "employee" in a bill on another subject last year.

I know that I do not have to assure you that Senator George will keep his Committee at work on this bill until he has secured the best results he can obtain through painstaking study and deliberation. He is very well aware of the administrative difficulties involved.

Thank you for sending me the telegram you sent to Senator George, and Mrs. Hobby's letter to Senator Connally. I am sure both will be helpful to me in my own study of the measure.
