Dallas 'Hems' Over Jones Plan on Big Airport

DALLAS, Sept. 1 (P).—City councilmen Wednesday reviewed Commerce Secretary Jones' offer to relocate the administration building at Midway Airport, but indicated they would postpone a decision until after a meeting with the citizens' master airport committee.

"Before the city council passes

upon Mr. Jones' request that Dallas and Fort Worth join Arlington in sponsoring Midway, we want to review the problem with the citizens' committee headed by Nathan Adams," Mayor Woodall Rodgers declared. "This meeting can't be held for several days, since Mr. Adams is out of the city. "I can't say that the problem is solved by Mr. Jones' offer to move

solved by Mr. Jones' offer to move the building site from the west side of the field, nearer Fort Worth, to the northwest corner.

"We still feel that Dallas is entitled to a super airport of its own. Before we act, we want to be sure that Dallas sponsorship of Midway won't destroy our plans for aviation development in Dallas. We want to be sure that we would get a fair deal from the airlines in the use of our airport and in the operation of Midway. We want to know whether the CAA plans to transfer commercial aviation from Love Field to Mid-

way and use Love Field purely as

a military field."
