

Federal Funds May Assist Airport Project

Federal aid for development of an adequate airport program may develop in legislation now pending in Washington, city officials learned Monday, and they expressed keen interest in the proposal since it would aid the municipality tremendously in its contemplated expansion program.

There is some national thought that the Federal Government will aid in developing a network of airports throughout the nation in the future in the same way that the federal system of highways has been aided and created, officials learned.

Councilmen, meanwhile, are veering back to the thought of making Love Field the basis for the super-airport to serve this city and indications are that considerable aid in this project can be obtained from the Federal Government through the War Department.

Expansion of Love Field to provide a system of parallel runways at least 6,000 feet long would mean the acquisition of considerable more property by the city, but the Federal Government is expected to provide the paving and other airport facilities.
