I enclose herewith copy of a letter from Mrs. Edward B. Healy, which is self-explanatory.

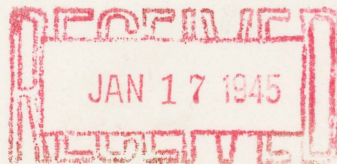
I am very happy that we have in part made restitution for the theft of the articles which Mrs. Healy's deceased husband had placed in the mail for his family.
