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G. J. Brandewiede, materials director of American Airlines will be named vice-president of maintenance and supply, a new department to be formed in the company Jan. 1.

Marvin Whitlock will become assistant vice-president of the new department, in charge of American's overhaul base at Tulsa, Okla. He is now assistant director of engineering there.

Functions now handled in three departments will be brought under one vice-president, according to American Airlines President C.R. Smith. The new organization will combine the related jobs of maintenance, overhaul, service engineering, purchasing and stores.

Departmental headquarters will be at LaGuardia airport, New York.

A major segment of the department will be based at Tulsa to operate American's huge overhaul base.
