GIANT AIRPLANE READY FOR TRIP

Newspaper Executives Will Be Passengers When Big S-42 Goes Southward

NEW YORK, Aug. 15 (U.P.)—The giant S-42, largest amphibian plane in the world, recently tested by Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, leaves this week on its maiden trip to South America with newspaper executives making a full complement of passengers.

The passenger list of Pan-American's big Sikorsky includes: John Cowles of Des Moines Register; Roy W. Howard, chairman of the board of the Scripps-Howard Publications; J. H. Furay, vice president of the United Press; Frank Gannett, publisher of the Gannett newspapers; William Brooks of the Associated Press; Paul Patterson of the Baltimore Sun, and George Rial, Pan-American executive. All will embark at New York.

At Miami S. Swazey of Los Angeles and Amon Carter, Fort Worth Star-Telegram publisher, will board the ship.
