**NEWSPAPER MEN  
MAKING TRIP IN  
LARGEST PLANE**

NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—(LP)—The giant S-42, largest amphibian plane in the world, recently tested by Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, leaves this week on its maiden trip to South America with newspaper executives making a full complement of passengers.

The passenger list of Pan-American's big Sikorsky includes: John Cowles of Des Moines Register; Jerome Barnum, Syracuse publisher; Roy W. Howard, chairman of the board of the Scripps-Howard publications; J. H. Furay, vice-president of the United Press; Frank Gannett, publisher of the Gannett newspapers; William Brooks, of the Associated Press; Paul Patterson, of the Baltimore Sun; John Wheeler, of the Bell Syndicate, and George Rial, Pan-American executive. All will embark at New York.

They will be joined at Washington by Juan Trippe, president of Pan-American Airways, and Eugene Vidal, department of commerce official.

At Miami the following will board the ship: James G. Stahlman, Nashville publisher; S. Swazey of Los Angeles; Amon Carter, Fort Worth Star-Telegram publisher; Edward Tomlinson of National Broadcasting Co.; Evan Young of Pan-American Airways, and Hirschell V. Jenkins, Savannah Morning News publisher.
