JUNIOR-SENIOR RITUAL



Explanation: This ritualistic ceremony was devised in order that Texas Christian University might take its place with many of the leading universities in having a formal ceremony in which the graduating Seniors of the institution would be able to turn over the administration of the school and convey all seniority rights to the Juniors, who would be the Seniors for the coming year.

(Both classes rise).

Dickey: "Members of the Junior Class, you are about to be endowed with the privileges and duties of carrying on the work of the Senior Class of this institution for the coming school year. Our years here have ended, but to you falls the lot of accomplishing that which we have failed to do, of starting new projects, some of which you will complete, but only preparing others which shall serve as stepping stones in the success and renown of our beloved Alma Mater. Do you feel competent to receive such an endowment?"

Junior Class (in unison): "We do."

- Senior Class (in unison): "Do you, the members of the incoming Senior Class, solemnly promise to execute all duties faithfully, to perpetuate all ideals, and to maintain at all times your love for the University which you represent?"
- Junior Class (in unison): "We, the members of the Junior Class, do solemnly promise to carry out faithfully all the duties within our realm; to complete that which has been left unfinished; to accomplish within our humble limitations that which is necessary for the perpetuation of the ideals upon which Texas Christian University is founded; and above all, to maintain at all times that everlasting and eternal love for our dear Alma Mater."
- Dickey (walks over to Miller and presents him with a gavel): "My successor, to you I present this symbol of leadership that you may carry on the work which we Seniors have left unfinished. We wish you and your class every success in the furtherance of your tasks, and we pledge ourselves as alumni to aid you in every manner possible."
- Miller: "Mr. Dickey, the responsibilities and duties you have conveyed to us are indeed great, but we shall endeavor to carry on in a manner worthy of Texas Christian University and the ideals for which it stands." (Handshake.)

(Both classes are seated.)
