Dear Mr. Carter:

I am glad to note in your letter to Mr. Garner, received late last evening, that you will be in Washington the latter part of the week, and can talk the matters in which you are interested, over with those in power. Mr. Garner is away from home therefore I cannot express myself for him.

I do know this, however, and agree with you, that the direction of the expenditure of the Texas portion of the \$500,000,000.00 gratuity to relieve the destitute should be placed in the hands of the highest type of people, and that Mr. Garner has already sent criticisms in regard to the matter to Farley, Hopkins and General Johnson.

Of course you will not read this letter until after you have conferred with all these Washington people, but I want you to know that we are interested in the proper expenditure of this money, and that Mr. Garner has been active.

We are happy to be at home even if there isn't the opportunity for rest that we might desire. I might say though, that work has become second nature with me and if I found myself idle I might wonder "Is this I or is this not I".
