Your favor of the 20th, with enclosure, is received.


I have just talked to Fritz and he says that he is not committed to anyone for postmaster at Fort Worth; that all applicants have until January 2d to register for the purpose of standing Civil Service examination; and after the examination is had and an eligible list is offered, he will then make up his mind as to who he will recommend for postmaster. I think this is all the information that can be had in the premises.

Now, it is up to you and others who are interested in Mr. Young, and other candidates, to see Mr. Lanham and convince him that you have the right man. He did say to me that he was very fond of Mr. Young though he would not commit himself at this time, which policy, if I may be permitted to say so, I think is the correct one.
