Your delightful telegram received by Dr. Knapp at the Fort Worth Club prior to the presentation of the bronze bust to the Texas Technological College through its President, Dr. Bradford Knapp.

The presentation, as you will note from the enclosed pictures, was in your old room, 10-G, at the Fort Worth Club. They show Mrs. Carter, Electra Waggoner and Dr. Knapp in one of them; another view is Electra Waggoner and her mother, Mrs. Paul Waggoner; another Electra Waggoner, Dr. Knapp and myself and one general picture of all of us. There has been a constant stream of people down to the room to see the bust and everyone is delighted with it. It is really better than indicated by the pictures. The inscription on the bust is as follows:

December 30, 1937."
