

# GEN. FOULOIS HOPS OFF FOR FORT SILL

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Gen. Benjamin D. Foulois, assistant chief of the Army Air Corps, took off at 8:30 o'clock Friday morning for Fort Sill, Okla., after an overnight stop in Fort Worth.

The general and Capt. Arthur McDaniel, army pilot, are on a tour of inspection of army air units. They expect to spend Friday night in Muskogee, Okla. General Foulois is flying a Douglass observation plane, while Captain McDaniel is in a training ship.

Entertained Thursday night with a dinner at Shady Oak Farm, General Foulois recalled his first visit here 16 years ago with the entire air corps of seven ships. Foulois was a captain then (November, 1915).

Captain Foulois and his fellow pilot-officers were guests of honor at a dinner given in the Metropolitan Hotel, in a room now used as the private office of Jack H. Hott, manager of the Chamber of Commerce. Amon G. Carter was toastmaster and, as a memento of the occasion, has an autographed menu.
