
We have just received notice from an appointee to West Point, who was to take the examination this year, that he has had to change his plans, and resigns the appointment.

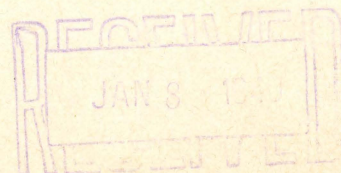
