Dear Mr. Carter:



He inquired regarding the size of the painting but I did not know this, but did say I presumed there would be little difference in size. Mr. Adair proposed that he should come to Fort Worth either at the end of this week or first of next, by automobile, and carry the painting back with him, if this is satisfactory to you. So please let me know about this so that I may communicate with him.

As to the proposed plate or plaque he thinks there should be one with the picture, and he suggests that it should read: "Presented to the Texas Memorial Museum by Amon G. Carter", and also carry the artist's name in an appropriate place.
