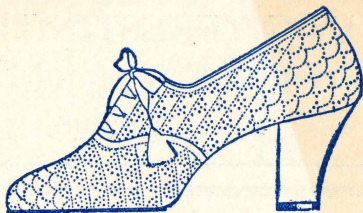

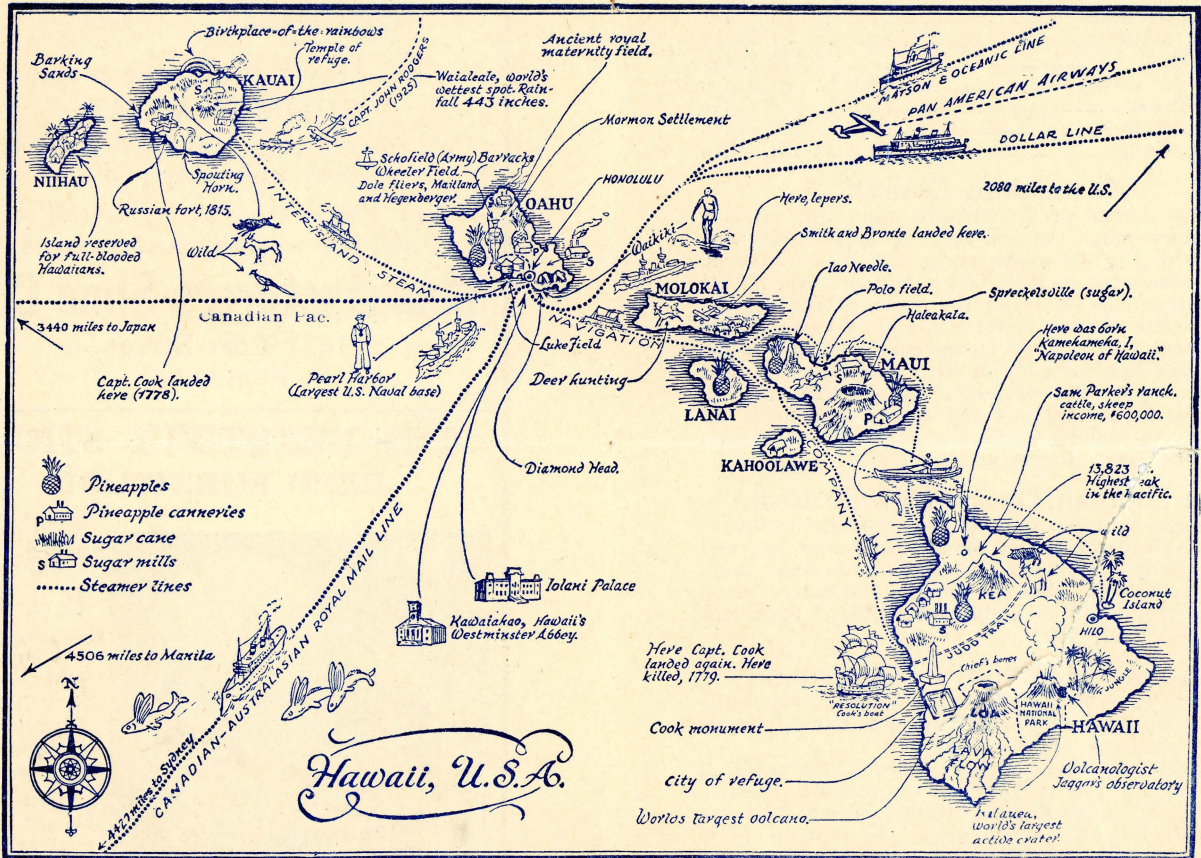

### Kawaihau Church

At the corner of Punchbowl and King Streets stands Kawaihau Church, the first building of worship erected by the missionaries and their converts. It was completed in 1843, being built of coral blocks carried from the shore on the backs of the congregation. The church history is rich in atmosphere of the past. In a stone mausoleum adjacent to the churchyard lies the body of King Lunalilo who died in 1874. Today the services at Kawaihau are conducted in Hawaiian, and the church has been the scene of the funeral services of Hawaii's royal dead within the past. Phone 92223 for car.

### The Sampan Dock—Kewalo Basin

Here you will see the famous Japanese sampans. Take a ride down to Ala Moana Road and you will see Honolulu's fishermen's wharf. These little boats sail hundreds of miles to Johnson Island to bring home a full catch of edible fish. Phone 92223 for Royal Hawaiian Taxi.

### Kailua—Honolulu's Playground

Without a visit to Honolulu's playground the beach at Kailua would be like going to San Francisco and not seeing the Cliff House.

So when you make up your mind to see the Pali just ask the driver of your car to continue on down the Pali and on to Kailua. Kailua is only 12 miles from Honolulu, the beach proper is a public park, has all modern buildings and conveniences, public showers, etc., so just pack up a little picnic lunch and spend a day of real enjoyment, on the world's best beach, the sand is like velvet, and the water is just right, you will agree.
