Pact Is Kept

Amon Carter Signs For Flight

LOS ANGELES—(AP)—Keeping a pact made for him by the late Will Rogers four years ago, Amon G. Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth, Texas, Star-Telegram, arrived here Sunday by airliner enroute to the Orient as one of the first seven passengers in the trans-Pacific China Clipper plane of Pan-American airways.

In 1932, when the trans-Pacific line was proposed, Rogers was declared by company officials to have given them a blank check with the request:

"See that I get the first ticket, and

put Amon Carter down too because he wouldn't miss a chance like that."

Rogers and Wiley Post were killed last year on an Alaskan flight, but Carter is keeping the tryst.
