**TEXAN TO MAKE
PACIFIC FLIGHT**

Los Angeles, Cal., Oct. 11.—AP— Keeping a pact made for him by the late Will Rogers four years ago, Amon G. Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth (Tex.) Star-Telegram, arrived here today by airliner en route to the Orient as one of the first seven passengers in the trans-Pacific China Clipper plane of Pan-American Airways.

In 1932, when the trans-Pacific line was proposed, Rogers was declared by company officials to have given them a blank check with the request:

"See that I get the first ticket, and put Amon Carter down, too, because he wouldn't miss a chance like that."

Rogers and Wiley Post were killed last year on an Alaskan flight, but Carter is keeping the tryst.

Soon after his arrival here today the Texas publisher went with friends to the St. Mary's-Loyola football game.
