Publisher Keeps Will Rogers Pact

Humorist Booked Texan for Trans-Pacific Flight

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 11.—(AP) —Keeping a past made for him by the late Will Rogers four years ago, Amon G. Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth, Texas, Star-Telegram, arrived here Sunday by airliner en route to the Orient as one of the first seven passengers in the trans Pacific China Clipper plane of an-American Airways.

In 1932, when the trans Pacific was proposed, Rogers was declared by company officials to have given them a blank check with the request:

“See that I get the first ticket, and put Amon Carter down, too, because he wouldn’t miss a chance like that.”
