Dear Mr. Carter:



It gives me great pleasure to be able to send you a few photographs taken by myself of what was a very great occasion, the accomplishment of a splendid achievement and the accomplishment of a long cherished dream.

Permit me to add my humble words of congratulation to the very many you have received from others, highly placed, but as one who has been privileged to know the extent of your achievement and the long, patient months of hard work I feel that my congratulations, humble though they be, are truly sincere. It is my earnest wish that the accomplishment that terminated in the landing of the Philippine Clipper at Macao yesterday will be translated into profitable enterprise for many, many years to come.

I enclose the "currency" required by Mr. Carter. You will find some Chinese notes and coins, also employed in Macao for trading purposes, so as to use up the entire \$1 note.

I have called on the Postmaster regarding the sending of the letters for Mr. Carter, but no arrangements exist in Macao for forwarding mail to be carried by the Clipper from Manila. He has promised, however, to try to make special arrangements and has undertaken to let me know tomorrow what can be done.
