Travelers Cheques: Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr.

We acknowledge and thank you for your letter December 14th concerning a purchase of American Express Travelers Cheques by Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., presently a prisoner of the Germans.

We have placed a stop payment against the Travelers Cheques enumerated in the communication.

- 1. Do you know what disposition was made of the Travelers Cheques? We presume they were destroyed.
- 2. When Travelers Cheques are lost, destroyed or stolen, it is customary for the purchaser to complete an Affidavit for Refund upon American Express Travelers Cheques. Attached is that form, with instructions.

Ordinarily, we would communicate with the purchaser at the address supplied. Before doing so, we shall appreciate your reaction. It is possible you may wish to send the form to Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr.. If you do, may we have transmittal copy of your letter for our record.

If you consider it advisable for us to communicate direct, as soon as we receive your answer, we shall do so.

Enclosed is a business reply envelope for answer.

PLEASE READ BEFORE PREPARING THE ATTACHED "AFFIDAVIT FOR REFUND"

To expedite settlements for the alleged loss of American Express Travelers Cheques, and in order to take steps to recover the Travelers Cheques or prevent their negotiation, the claimant should complete the attached blank form of Affidavit. Each blank space should be filled in, especially the lower portion page one, explaining where, when and how the loss occurred. THIS IS IMPORTANT.

It is necessary to have full particulars concerning losses, because lost or stolen American Express Travelers Cheques often get into the hands of unscrupulous persons who forge signatures of owners. To obtain convictions, full particulars are helpful.

The signature should be the same as on the Travelers Cheques.

Married women should sign given name and married name, for example, "Mary Citizen (Mrs. John Citizen)".

If an additional sheet is required to give all the facts, the sheet should be initialed. Do not use the reverse of page one, if required use the additional sheet. If it is necessary to make any corrections, they should be initialed in the margin.

The Affidavit should be sworn to before a Notary Public.
