Dear Mr. Davis:

Mr. Carter received a message from the Adjutant's General Office of the War Department on April 14th, 1943 as follows:

"Your son Second Lieutenant Amon G. Carter, Junior reported a prisoner of war of the German Government. letter follows."

This was following a message received March 11th, advising Mr. Carter that his son had been reported missing in action in the North Africa area as of February 14th.

Mr. Carter naturally is exceedingly anxious to ascertain at what camp in Germany Amon Junior is, how we could attempt to get messages to him, write him, hear from him or any of these things that are possible and since this information has been given by the War Department perhaps your organization in Switzevland could help us communicate with Amon Junior in some way, or at least find out where he is.

Amon's serial number is 0-402537 and he was in the 91st Field Artillery, Battery B, First Armored Division.

Any assistance you may be able to render shall be gratefully appreciated.
