The City of Boston is putting on its best bib and tucker for the first annual "Boston Jubilee," a five day extravaganza to be held May 18 to 22.

It's the city's first big attempt to focus national attention on Boston as a leading community for business, education and pleasure. Hundreds of thousands of vacationists are expected at The Hub from all over the nation. Those flying to Boston will find 64 daily American Airlines to serve them to and from Boston.

Many thousands will sit down to a mammoth baked bean supper, Boston's traditional Saturday night fare, at five miles of tables on the Common. The menu will include five tons of Boston baked beans, 6000 pounds of potato salad and 12,000 individual apple pies.

Secretary of the Army Gordon Gray will be the city's honored guest on Defense Day, May 19. There will be a parade and demonstrations by military planes. Naval craft in the harbor will be the scene of an open house.

A new pier will be dedicated May 22, Maritime Day. Another day will be devoted to the interests of businessmen, with executives from all over the nation discussing "The Future of the Individual under Capitalism."

Concerts, tours of historical landmarks and college open houses will continue throughout the five days. Logan International airport, Bedford airport and Squantum Naval Air Station will all hold open houses.

Social events will include the Jubilee ball and a huge square dance in Boston Garden with more than 4000 participating. The first outdoor fashion show in New England will be staged on the Mall.
