American Airlines to Hold Directors Board Meeting in Mexico City Oct. 19

Mexico City has been selected as the site for the annual board of directors meeting of American Airlines, Inc., representing the first time that such an event takes place outside the United States.

The meeting will be held on Oct. 19. Canada and several other countries were mentioned at preliminary board meetings as probable sites to hold this reunion, but Mexico City was finally chosen.

Prominent U. S. bankers, industrialists, business men, as well as members of the press, are represented on the board.

Among the persons who will attend the meeting are C. R. Smith, chairman of the board and president of American Airlines; Harold T. Ames, industrial engineer of Chicago, president and director of La Porte Corp.; Harry E.
