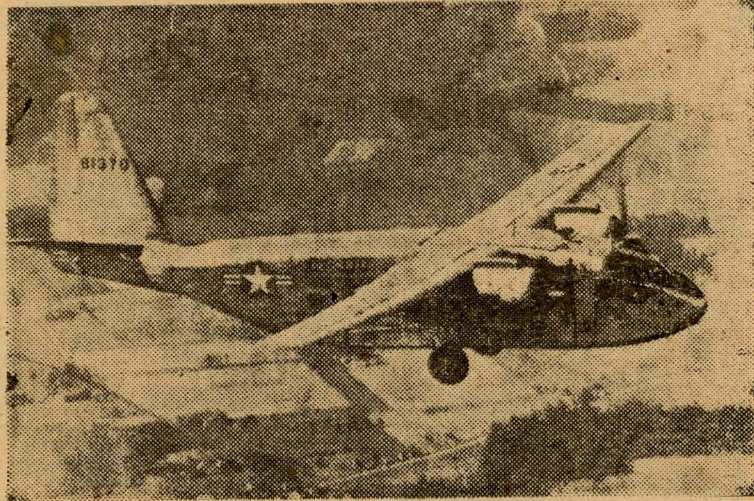

The first members of the board of directors of American Airlines, Inc., have started to arrive here to attend their forthcoming annual meeting which will be held in this city starting Oct. 19.

Edgar M. Queeny, chairman of the board of Monsanto Chemical Corp., and member of the AA board, arrived here yesterday in his special deluxe DC-3. Queeny will attend today's ceremony at Monsanto Mexicana's plant at Lecheria where the Mexican corporation will be presented with an efficiency award.

Then, later today, he will set his plane's course for Acapulco where he will rest until Friday's meeting of the AA board.

\* Gov. Ignacio Morones Prieto of Nuevo Leon, returned to Monterrey yesterday on a CMA Clipper after having spent several days in Mexico City attending matters pertaining to his post.

The governor also came to attend the PRI national convention which resulted in the nomination of Adolfo Ruiz Cortines, former Secretary of the Interior, as the governing party's candidate in the July presidential elections.
