

# Nazis Move POW Camps

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28 (AP). — Chairman Basil O'Connor of the Red Cross announced here that three German prisoner of war camps situated between Poznan and Torun in Poland may have been moved from the path of the Russian drive.

One camp, not named, has been officially announced as moved, O'Connor said, adding that "it is taken for granted that the two others, Stalag 20A and Oflag 64 also have been moved."

A prominent Texan in Washington said he had learned from three repatriated prisoners of Oflag 64 that the camp was moved intact, between Jan. 10 and 12 to Sagen, Germany, a town about 80 miles south of Berlin.
