Dear Mr. Carter:

The Army Air Forces have selected five officers and seven enlisted men, all prisoners of Germany and Japan until a few months ago, as personnel for a nation-wide tour of thirty major cities to bring next-of-kin first hand information on prison camp life.

The personnel has been increased from ten to twelve to include two men who survived the torpedoing of a Jap prison ship off the Philippines.

The two months tour was arranged by the AAF in cooperation with the American Red Cross.


At the close of each meeting all the repatriates and escapees will talk with separate groups of next-of-kin and others who are particularly interested in the camps where they were confined.

Lieutenant Colonel Joseph B. Kavanaugh, of Chicago, will explain the functions of the American Prisoners of War Information Bureau of the Provost Marshall General's Office.

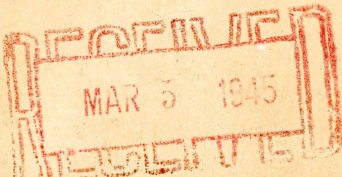
This meeting will be held in the Fair Park Auditorium, Dallas, Texas, Wednesday, March 14, 1945, at 8:00 P. M.
