Dear Miss Roggen:

Your letter of May 27th received and I am delighted that your brother has received mail from home and that you have heard from him again.

The past week we have been receiving cards and letters from Amon Junior dated in April and one card in May (7th) which arrived in New York May 24th - seventeen days - the quickest time since Amon Junior has been a prisoner of war. He seems to be getting along all right and remains in good spirits. In a letter received this morning dated April 25th he told of a hundred more officers arriving, seven of which were Texans. Lt. James B. Tatum of Houston was among them and a boy from Dallas and the others were from small towns in the state.

I, too, am anxious for an opportunity to see and talk with Larry Allen when he returns to this country; however, inasmuch as I am not acquainted with him I am enclosing a letter of introduction for you to Mr. Kent Cooper of the Associated Press who I am sure will make an effort to arrange a meeting with Mr. Allen.
