Your letter of August 2 has been received advising that you have heard from your son and that he is receiving good treatment and hopes to be out of the hospital soon. I know that you, as well as your daughter-in-law, are very happy that he has received the citation of a Silver Star, as well as the Purple Heart. This is a very deserved recognition and we are delighted that it has been granted.

Mr. Carter is out of the city at present, however he has six or seven communications from Amon Junior written from his prison camp in Germany. He has been ill and lost about 40 pounds and has only two meals a day, but his letters sound very cheerful and indicate that he has not lost his spirit. Mr. Carter's last letter was dated July 4. Amon has been moved to Poland, is sleeping under three blankets and says he hates to think what the winter will be like.

Your letter shall be brought to Mr. Carter's attention and I know how happy he will be to know that you have heard from your son.
