Mr. Record:

While I was at the station to cover the POW story I talked to Lt. Col. Gaines J. Barron of 3200 Ethel Street, Waco, who was in charge and he asked me if I knew where Mr. Carter might be reached. The Colonel had called in the hope of talking to him about his son.

Col. Barron was in the same prisoncamp as young Mr. Carter and while he did not give me the time on this event, he said that a group of prisoners were transferred and supposedly sent farther into Germany among whom was Mr. Carter's son. At the time of the transfer Col. Barron said he was well and safe and none of the prisoners then had received too much ill treatment and conditions were not too serious and did not become so until after the invasion had begun. I have the impression that the transfer in which Mr. Carter's son was included took place not too long before the remaining prisoners were^e liberated.

Col. Barron asked that I pass along to Mr. Carter the assurance that he, the Colonel, will talk to him within the next few days. Col. ~~W~~ Barron will be in San Antonio tomorrow, of course, and as quickly as his formalities may be disposed of he will go to his home at Waco and from there contact Mr. Carter.
