Dear Mrs. Batte:

Thank you very much for your letter of April 1 quoting a card which you received from Lt. Batte.

Amon Junior's mother called from New York this morning advising that she had received a card from Amon dated February 7 in which he said that he was very tired and was anxious to come home, not to send anything but food and that he was at Stalag III A at Luckenwalde. He also told her that he was writing me at the same time; however, I have had nothing from him as yet.

Mrs. Jones of Austin has a letter from her husband, Lt. Col. Hal Jones Jr. dated February 7 in which he advised that he was at Luckenwalde and that "Ferguson and Carter" were with him. A Mr. White of Monroe, Louisiana received a card dated March 1 from his son who said he was at Parchim and thought his probable destination would be Hammelburg, so it would seem that these boys have been split up and I am wondering if Lt. Batte and Amon are still together.

In any event, I appreciate your passing this information along and shall be glad to give you any as soon as it arrives.
