possibly expedite our first mail del-  
ivery as P.O.W.'s. Now all of us have  
received both letters AND parcels of  
food, clothing AND tobacco. EACH of  
the families has described the  
unsolicited aid you have given  
them in details as to our where-  
abouts AND mail instructions. It  
has enabled us to hear from home  
weeks earlier AND I AM sure it  
served to relieve much anxiety  
there. We are all grateful beyond  
words to you, Mr. Carter, for all of  
your assistance AND kindness. EACH  
sends his greetings AND best wishes.

I see AMON daily AND talk with him  
often. He is kept pretty busy at a  
camp job, AND all the while doing us  
a great service.

All here are well AND eagerly await-  
ing a speedy reunion.
