Have been intending to write you for some time since we got started on the home stretch. I know what it means to you, particularly; Amon Jr should soon be loose and back home again. It may be that we will get to him soon and it would be a great pleasure to me to be there when he and the others were freed. I hope the experts are right in their predictions and that this thing will be over soon. Certainly the boys--the fighting ones in the infantry and similar branches are doing their job to get it done. Our reception here has been enthusiastic, and I believe, sincere in contrast to Italy. I have no respect whatsoever for that race and don't agree with the apparent efforts at home to entertain them. Believe that most of the boys here feel the same way. The only thing that bunch of coyotes did for us was to preen around until they got their pants kicked off--then quit and rob every American in their country by charging them exorbitant prices for anything they bought. I am just plain "agin em". They got licked--let them take their medicine. Hope the last news you had from your boy was good and wonder if he knows any of the news. Hope the Doctor, Jay, Hugh and all the folks are well. Give them my regards. Good luck.
