Gentlemen:

Mr. Carter's son, Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., has been a German prisoner of war for sixteen months and has asked that books on newspaper work as well as a German grammar be sent to him.

We have selected "Newspaper Management" (revised edition) by Frank B. Thayer, University of Wisconsin. As you know these book packages can be sent only by publishers and the weight limit is five pounds per month. Naturally, we do not know the weight of this particular book but if it is less than five pounds, would it be asking too much to ask that you have someone get in touch with Publishers Sarrar and Rinehart, 232 Madison Avenue, New York City, and ask that they furnish you a copy of "Introduction to German" by Louis Dvries to go in the same package. In other words, it is our purpose to get as many books to him as possible and since we are allowed only one book package each month not to exceed five pounds, we would like to enclose both books in the one package. Of course, if they exceed the five pound weight limit, then please send your book "Newspaper Management" and advise the cost which will be remitted at once. Then the German Grammar can be sent the following month.
