Dear Mr. Carter:

Because you were directly in touch with my son, Captain Paul Brown and have a son in the same Division I think you might be able to help us now.

We had a telegram yesterday from the government saying he was "seriously wounded in the African campaign on February 14th". That's all they said.

Needless to tell you we are frantically following any lead that might get us more information. He mentioned having met you with his Colonel I believe and you so kindly had Mrs. Carter call us at Christmas.

We tried to cable Colonel Summerall and have him wire us any available information collect, but Western Union couldn't send a cable to him without having his Serial number.

Can you think of any one you might contact for us? It seems to be asking a lot but we just feel you might be able to do something.

Good luck to your son and thank you very much.
