Lt. Amon Carter, Jr. Is Reported Missing

**Publisher's Son
Was In Action
In Tunisia**

Word that Lt. Amon G. Carter Jr. is missing in action in Tunisia came today to his father, publisher of the Star-Telegram.

A telegram from Maj. Gen. James A. Ulio, adjutant general, stated that Lieutenant Carter's artillery unit was in action near Sbeitla, in northern Tunisia, on Feb. 14, and that he was missing after that action.

Lieutenant Carter was graduated from Culver Military Academy as a reserve officer and entered active service in July, 1941. After training at Fort Knox, his outfit went to northern Ireland and then to England, and later to Africa with the Allied invasion. He was 33 years old.

Mr. Carter Sr. went to Ireland and England last fall and spent several weeks with his son.
