Amon Carter's Son 90
Believed Nazi Prisoner

WITH U. S. FORCES IN SOUTH-ERN TUNISIA, March 3—(Delayed) (P)—Second Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., son of the Fort Worth, Texas, publisher, and a forward observer for a field artillery battalion, has been reported missing in action and is believed to be a prisoner in German hands.

Carter, who was described by his superior officers as "a fine officer," was established in an advanced observation post on Lessouda hill facing Faid Pass when a German panzer horde staged a Valentine's day attack, Feb. 14, in that region.

Carter's father is president and publisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram.
