Amon Carter's Son Believed 90 To Be Prisoner

WITH U. S. FORCES IN SOUTHERN TUNISIA, March 3. (Delayed) (AP)—Second Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., son of the Fort Worth, Texas, publisher, and a forward observer for a field artillery battalion, has been reported missing in action and is believed to be a prisoner in German hands.

Carter, who was described by his superior officers as "a fine officer," was established in an advanced observation post of Lesouda Hill facing Faid Pass when a German Panzer horde staged a Valentine's Day attack, February 14, in that region.

Carter's father is president and publisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram.
